Fundación "la Caixa"

In 2008 the *Fundación "la Caixa"* initiated an innovative programme to offer international fellowships for PhD students to carry out their thesis projects in Spanish Biomedical research centres of excellence. The CNIO was chosen as one of four such centres in Spain. The four year programme supports up to 10 fellows at the CNIO who are selected after an international Call and competitive selection process. The 2010 Call was a tremendous success, drawing more than 334 applications. The 10 selected students are already working on their thesis projects in the following CNIO Programmes: Molecular Oncology (2 students), Molecular Pathology (2), BBVA Foundation – CNIO Cancer Cell Biology (1), Human Cancer Genetics (1), Structural Biology and Biocomputing (3) and Clinical Research (1).
